HELD AT THE STAR HOTEL, GOLD COAST QLD, AUSTRALIA 18TH MAY AND 20TH MAY 2017

On Thursday 18th May the Oceania's AGM was held in The Pacific Room and attended by Gail Eraio as the current Cl Representative on the Oceania Executive Board and AhKim Tikaroa as a voting delegate. The AGM was attended by representatives from eleven countries namely Australia, Cook Islands, Fiji, Guam, New Caledonia, NZ, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Tahiti, Tonga, Tuvalu.

Executive committee positions were held on a two year rotational basis and this year our Cook Islands representative Gail Eraio stood down. The 2017 Executive Committee is now Loke Poh Wong (Aust.) Sunardi Li (Guam), Johanna Kou (New Caledonia), Glenn Cox (NZ), Dr Amanaki Fakakovikaetau (Tonga) with Geraldine Brown and Nigel Skelt remaining as President and Deputy President respectively.

A friendship formed last year between junior badminton players at the 2016 AIMS Games in Tauranga New Zealand has sparked a cultural exchange here on Rarotonga.

From the 13th – 21st July 8 students and 4 teachers and parents from Tolaga Bay Area School & Kahukuranui Badminton Team from the East Coast of the North Island of New Zealand made a year-long dream a reality.

Cook Islands Badminton took badminton teams from Nukutere College and Apii Avarua to compete at the 2016 AIMS Games where they not only excelled on the court but also off it making new friends with their NZ Maori counterparts.

Group Leader Koka Cynthia explained it was a series of fundraiser events like Housie that made the trip possible and that it was the children's initial persistence and wanting to visit Rarotonga that began the 'ball rolling' or should I say 'shuttle flying'.

They were overwhelmed by the hospitality and beauty of the island and excited about the local food and exotic fruits and most of all spending time with their Cook Island friends and families.

The group had organised matches against our CI Junior Development teams at the BlueSky Arena and matches with students from Papaaroa & Titikaveka College at Papaaroa Hall. They also took part in our Badminton Marathon fundraiser for our Junior development teams at Princess Anne Hall where they made a very generous cash donation as well as a donation of feather shuttles.



The Queens Baton arrived in the Cook Islands on Saturday 11th November 2017 and was greeted with all the ceremony and tradition of the Cook Islands. The colourful scene at Rarotonga International Airport included dancers, drummers, flower ei's, and a huge crowd.

During the five days of its stay on Rarotonga the Baton was carried round the island by teams of runners and vehicles representing all the codes of sport played on Rarotonga, youth organisations, and clubs. It even went to Church on the Sunday! As the Baton progressed through the villages the convoy was joined by people who just wanted to be part of the Relay, the drums were beaten and the noise and rhythms were very infectious.

Cook Islands Badminton joined the Relay at Blackrock taking over the Baton from the staff of Edgewater Resort and the Roadhouse Bar and Takeaway. The main road was blocked by all the participants, the traffic just had to wait until the procession had passed their respective area.

Cook Islands Badminton's newly designed and much larger banner stretched across the whole road and was shown off very proudly by Whitney Henry, Jeannine Daniel, Porora Wichman and Gail Eraio. CIBA Junior players had the honour of carrying the baton and were hopefully inspired to one day compete at the Commonwealth Games The Baton left Rarotonga on Wednesday 15th November en-route thru' the rest of Oceania, and New Zealand to arrive in Australia 24th December 2017. This Relay was a memorable occasion and will probably never be seen in the Cook Islands again for another 4 years so CIBA was very proud to have been part of this escort of the Queen's Baton.

NZ High Commission Fund New Water Station & Badminton poles









It was a special occasion for the Cook Islands Badminton Association (CIBA) when they celebrated the official handing over of a newly installed Water Station and locally manufactured Badminton poles purchased through the New Zealand High Commission Fund.

CIBA president Thomas Ngauru opened the ceremony, held at the St Joseph's Community Centre in Avarua, and welcomed special guests acting High-Commissioner Samantha Beckett, the coordinator for the New Zealand High Commission Fund, Victoria Williams and Bishop Paul Donoghue, as well as St Joseph School children. Ngauru spoke about the CIBA initiative, and how the High Commission had surpassed their expectations. "the kids are really loving their badminton and it was important to have a good source of drinking water while they're here," Ngauru said.

"We also have 12 netball poles. Initially we were just going to get badminton poles, but we didn't think that would be terribly useful.

So instead we thought why not turn them into netball poles, so they can use them for netball, and volleyball."
The poles have been sent to six primary schools around the island, and to all six of the badminton venues.

Beckett, who said that she remembered reading through the application, and was struck by how excellent the project looked, as it endeavoured to encourage children to participate in sport. The Shuttle Time Afterschool program and the new water station are just another fantastic example of how a community can come together to create an opportunity for the children."

Bishop Donoghue blessed the water station to cap off the special event.

Shuttle Time Coordinators from around the Oceania region gathered in beautiful Samoa in July for some Invaluable sharing and training of local volunteers.

Cook Islands Coordinator Thomas Ngauru was given the opportunity to share how the Cooks had gone about organising their Shuttle Time program and discuss the challenges and where and how they could be improve.

Badminton Oceania has always recognised Cook Islands Badminton as a prime example of how a small nation can take a simple plan and make it work. This will hopefully be a source of encouragement for Badminton Samoa who were using this workshop to revive badminton in the country.

From the Workshop relationships between the coordinators has grown and the future of badminton in the region is definitely looking brighter.



U15 Junior Development Camp Tauranga, NZ

The Cook Islands team were Kariana Hagai, Teatuanui George, Damus Matakino, Vaitoti Tupa and coach Ngaoa Ranginui. The trip included a 4 day development camp at the Auckland Badminton Hall alongside junior players from Tonga. Badminton Oceania Player Development Manager and New Zealand U19 Coach Robbie Thackham took the players through two 2 hour sessions each day for essential drills and lessons.

Thackham was focused on improving the player's footwork as well as their technical and game skills. Day 4 of the camp players were put through fitness testing which measured each players speed, endurance, agility, grip strength, horizontal and vertical jump and core strength.

At the conclusion of the camp the Oceania Junior Development players made their way down to Tauranga to compete in the Bay of Plenty Under 15 Nationals. The competition held over 2 days featured the top players from Auckland and members of the NZ team. The objective of this trip was to expose our junior players to high level training and competition.

The experience was invaluable and presented an opportunity to compete in a highly competitive environment and putting their newly learnt skills to the test. For some of our players the pressure a lot and affected their play but they were still able to give some glimpses of improvement.

The Cook Islands team also had the opportunity to experience badminton at an international level with front row seats at the SkyCity NZ Badminton Open Finals.

Badminton Oceania also provided quality equipment, accommodation, transport and meals and quality time to train with the Auckland Junior Badminton Squads.






