So with the permission of the Ministry of Culture 4 new courts were marked out at the National Auditorium the new venue for our Primary School & College tournaments in 2018.

Every year we try to improve and provide more opportunities, equipment and training for our players and with the assistance of Badminton Oceania we were able to purchase a brand new electric stringing machine.

Badminton Oceania & BWF continue to be a huge support which Cook Islands Badminton is truly grateful. We consider ourselves extremely lucky to have such awesome people encouraging and pushing us to strive higher and higher.

Lastly thank you everyone for your continuous support and we look forward to another memorable year in 2019

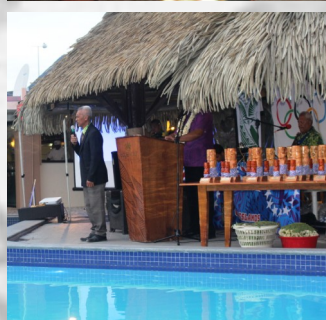

NCEA Level 3

CIBA has been delivering ShuttleTime classes to Tereora College NCEA level 3 students for the past 6 years. Supporting teachers with their lesson plans, classes and assessments. Each year the level of play improves and shows through the high pass rates amongst the students.

Working with the teachers and senior students has been a privilege and a joy which we hope to continue for years to come.

Ministry of Health NCD Afterschool Badminton Program

With the growing rates of obesity and NCD's amongst our people CIBA wanted to play there part in decreasing those numbers by providing weekly afterschool badminton for children around the island. Now into it's 2nd year, ShuttleTime classes were held at Papaaroa and St Josephs Halls from February through to November with assistance from the Ministry of Health

Working together with CI Football as part of their Just play monthly programme we again have been able to make badminton more accessible to children around the island. With hundreds of children attending regularly it has also allowed us raise the profile of the sport

Community Groups & Government Departments

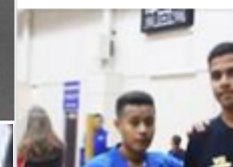

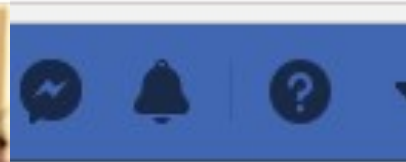

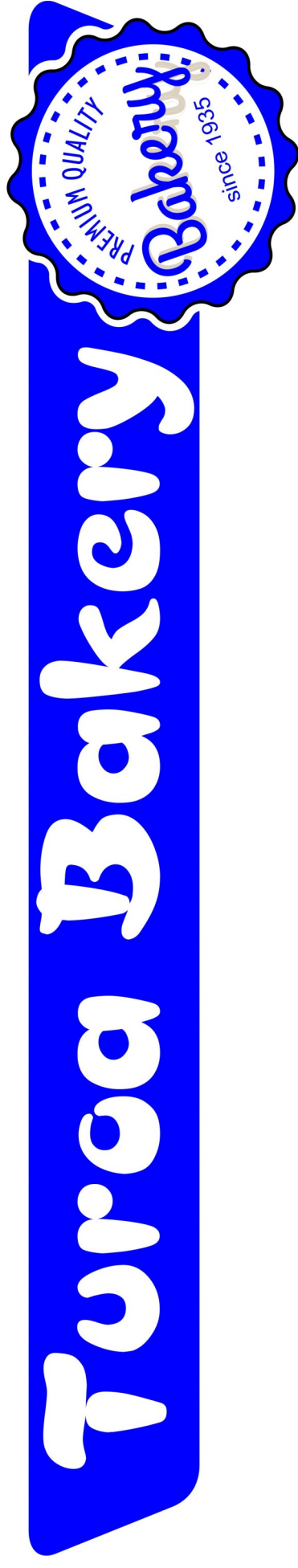
