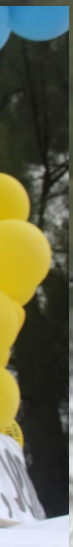
## Te Maeva Nui Float Parade

# Victor Oceania Championships Melbourne, Australia

The first Cook Islands Junior Badminton team to ever compete in an Oceania Junior Under19 Badminton Championship travelled to Melbourne Australia and returned with some excellent results.

The first four days was the individual knockout event where all 8 players competed in Singles, Doubles and mixed doubles. And despite being drawn against top seeded players from Australia and New Zealand they were competitive gaining respect from their opposition and other players and coaches. Being the youngest players in the competition did not discourage them either and going into the team event they were hungry for a win.

Each tie in the team event consists of 5 matches. (Mens & Ladies Singles, Mens & Ladies Doubles and Mixed Doubles). Each player can play a maximum of 2 matches and the team to win 3 or more matches is the winner. The Cook Islands was pooled with No.1 seeds NZ, Tahiti & Tonga where they managed an outstanding 3<sup>rd</sup> spot after beating Tonga in round robin competition. They continued their winning streak with a clean sweep of Samoa (4<sup>th</sup> Pool B) during the semi-finals only to then settle for 6<sup>th</sup> placing overall after being unable to repeat their win against Tonga in the finals for 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup>.





It was an extraordinary experience for our players who are now looking forward to the next Junior Oceania Champs in 2021. The Cook Islands badminton committee are extremely proud of our players and are ready for the next four years of more junior development which involve the AIMS Games in Tauranga, World Junior Badminton Championships and the World Youth Olympics in 2022

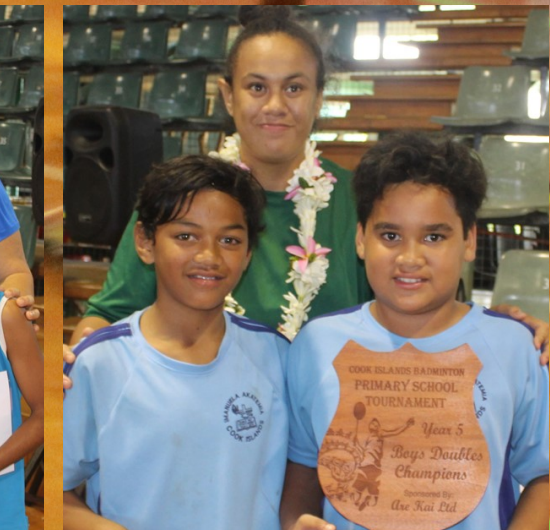

# AIMS Games

This year Cook Islands Badminton was proud to have 14 students represent the country from Nukutere College, Apii Avarua, Apii Nikao, St Josephs & Papaaroa School at this year's AIMS Games Badminton event. The students had been training well and expectations were high with the hopes they would bring back a medal – and they did!

## Singles Competition!

Each of the players were placed in groups of 5 to 6 players and after a 2-day round robin competition were then placed in Divisions according to how well they did in the group. Tereapii Akavi, Te Pa Tupa, Loureina Kureta, Emanuela & Daniel Akavi successfully made it through to division one after topping their groups.

Tereapii Akavi played an extraordinary match knocking out Number 2 seed Veronica Xia of Pinehurst Junior School 31-29. The whole arena was watching in anticipation practically hanging on every shot that was played – it wasn't funny at all. Unfortunately, Tereapii was unable to continue her winning streak losing to Helen Cao of Tau-ranga Intermediate in the Quarter finals. Te Pa Tupa also made it through to the Quarters losing to number 1 seed Lilian Cao of Murrays Bay Intermediate.

But the accolades did not end there with Tu-aanaore Mitchell and Tehani Matapo reaching the finals of Divisions 3 & 2 respectively. Tu-aanaore went up against Chloe Eng of Somerville Intermediate School and after some close points Tu-aanaore took out the match 31-27.

Tehani Matapo was actually runner-up to Chloe Eng last year in Division 3 and has managed one better making it to the finals of Division 2 against Caroline Chen of Bucklands Beach Intermediate. It was a closely fought match with Tehani unfortunately going down 31-19.

But the biggest was to come when Nukutere Colleges Tereapii & Te Pa Tupa won bronze in the Girls Singles Team event. It is the first ever medal won by any school from the Cook Islands and it wasn't the last.

## Doubles Competition!

Nukutere College doubles pairing of Tereapii Akavi and Tehani Matapo topped their group making it into division one and all the way to the Girls Doubles Final. It



began with a nailing biting semi-final against number one seeds Helen Cao & Brittany Jerkins of Tauranga Intermediate which they had to fight for to win 31-29. Then in the final the pair put up a valiant performance but had to settle for second place against number 3 seeds Coco Zhu & Gianna Lee of St Cuthbert's 21-14 21-12 and a Silver medal!

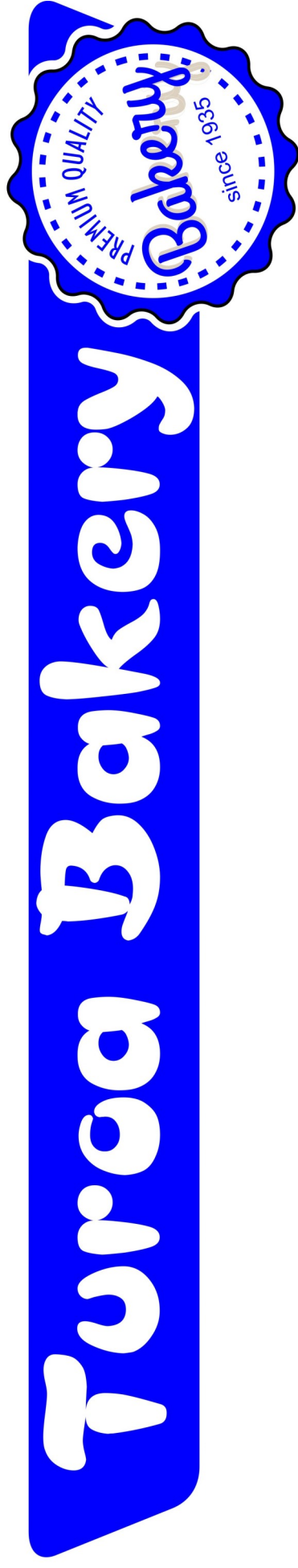
