The teams were met at the Airport by representatives of Badminton Oceania and Cook Islands Badminton.. As they came thru the Arrivals Gate we presented them with fresh eis - they loved them - their first taste of Cook Island culture. The Tournament was held over 5 days with 10 teams participating divided into 2 pools. Four teams came from NZ, four from Rarotonga and two with a mix of NZ and local players.

The mixed teams comprised local players and some players from overseas who wanted to play in the tournament but was not part of a team. One of the mixed teams included the newly elected President of Badminton Oceania Loke Poh Wong. It was wonderful to see the camaraderie in these mixed teams. Lots of laughs with some seriously good play when required. Unfortunately the weather let us down – on the second day it rained heavily and the roof of the TSA leaked very badly. We were able to move the venue to the Auditorium where we had four courts marked out and the tournament continued there.

The top positions in each pool were hotly contested with some exhausted players by the end of the Tournament. The standard of play from the very experienced Hawkes Bay players created impetus for local players to up their game and the final matches drew large audiences.

Amongst the players were an older couple Matheus and Lea who wowed everyone with their performances. Just shows you anyone can play this game ! Most of the players stayed at the Edgewater Resort and the Farewell Dinner and Prizegiving was held there on the Saturday night.

These classes are about giving children the opportunity to play and especially those who are keen to play more. It is also a great time to identify players who could potentially with more training represent the country in the future.

Shuttle Time Mitiaro

For the past 3 years now we have managed to deliver ShuttleTime classes and equipment to the southern group Islands. It is an expensive exercise that has only been possible with the financial assistance from BWF's Member Association Grant scheme.

This year CIBA's ShuttleTime Coordinator Hebrew Tom accompanied by Junior Squad member Daniel Akavi spent 3 days on the beautiful island of Mitiaro. Initially plans were to visit the island of Mangaia which CIBA will now visit in 2023

Arriving at 5pm, later than scheduled it was a quick dash to their accommodation then off to the Catholic Church grounds for the first community session. They were quickly reminded that a lot of these outer islands are made up of 'makatea' or coral rock which is very hard on the feet. But it was nothing for the locals who thoroughly enjoyed the session and didn't want to stop even when it was too dark to see.

Next Day more of the community turned up to the Air-badminton launch which was held on the islands new bowling green which was much softer for their Rarotonga feet. Then finally on the last day it was ShuttleTime with the school students and a teachers course at the local school before catching their flight back to Rarotonga.

The College Tournament was held at the National Auditorium over 2 days with the Junior Division on first followed by the Seniors the next day.

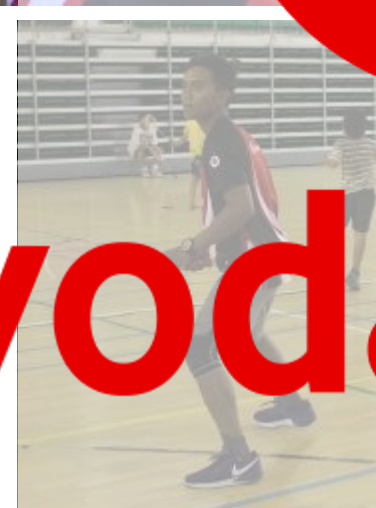
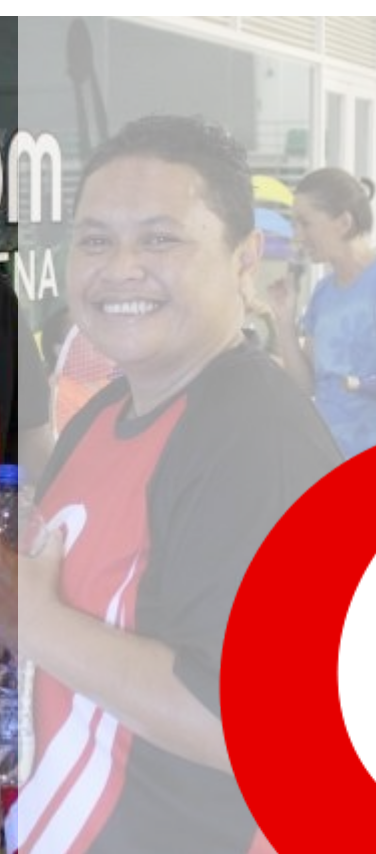
After 5 weeks of classes within the schools it was an opportunity for students to experience badminton in a competitive environment and test their skills against other

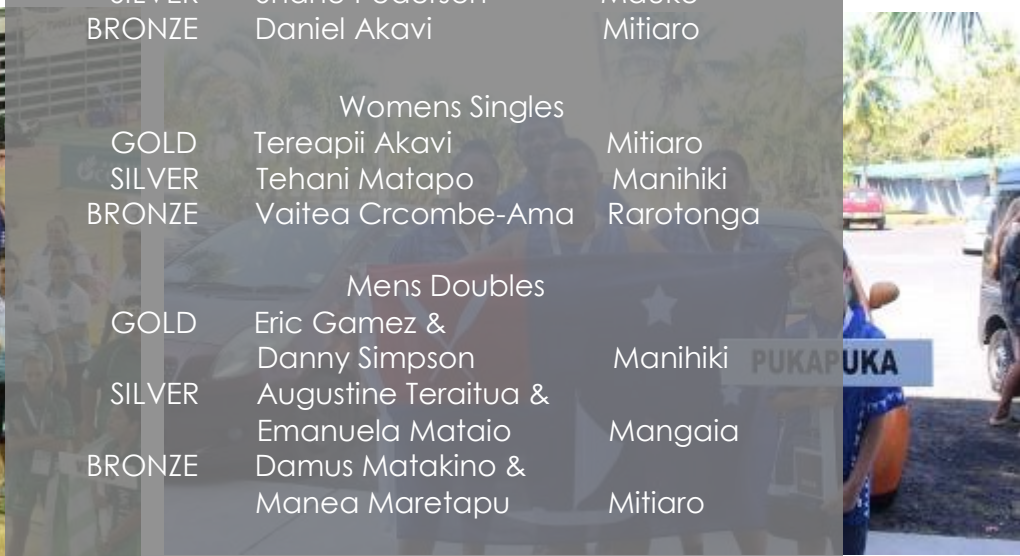
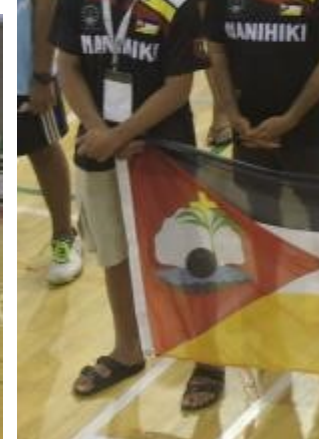

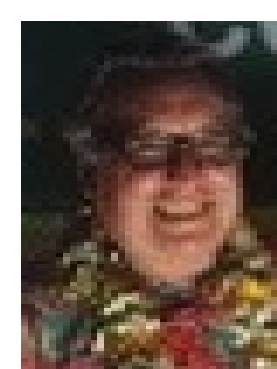
