Kia Orana Cook Islands Badminton family,

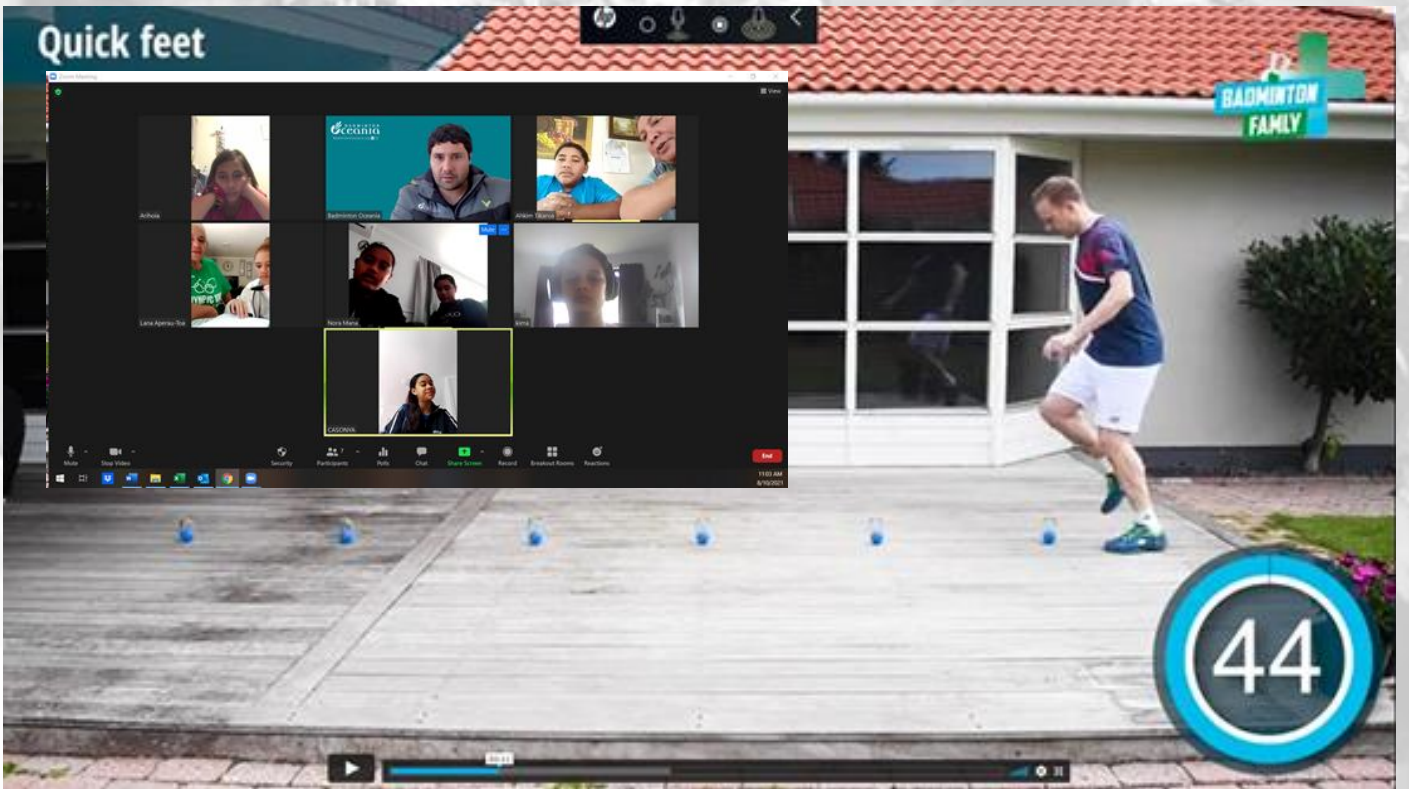
2021 has been another interesting year trying to continue development despite the challenges that COVID has brought us.
